Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

Our farm café is a quiet, family friendly venue that we intend to become integrated with the local community. We don't have capacity for large events, we're open mainly over weekends from 09:00 – 15:00.

We're working to attract people walking from surrounding villages whilst on walks in the country. We have a small car park, and we only offer a limited amount of coffee, soft drinks, baked goods and alcohol.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We will provide alcohol responsibly. We won't serve anyone who is drunk, neither will we be open late regularly. Importantly, the trailer is mainly a coffee and snacks venue, so space is limited and mainly taken up by coffee, soft drinks and baked goods! The volume of alcohol available will be very low.

We have CCTV around the farm, and Sophie's dad, who lives on site, is the watch manager of Newport Fire Station and works on the farm too!

#### c) Public safety

The café is situated in a fenced area protecting our guests from the car park and the byway next door. We're working collaboratively with the food standards agency to ensure we meet hygiene requirements and are aware of allergens. We have CCTV around the farm.

### d) The prevention of public nuisance

We will keep alcohol consumption on site. We have plenty of bins, including separation for recycling. The venue won't be open until late, nor will it be particularly loud! We have CCTV around the farm. There are very few houses nearby so we can easily limit disturbance.

### e) The protection of children from harm

Challenge 25 scheme.

We are two women (age 33 and 22) running the café – we don't intend to hire any staff. We're a family friendly location, with limited opening hours.

    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

  - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
