

Right to Buy landlords

To have the Right to Buy your home you must be a secure tenant of one of the following bodies:

- A district council
- A county council or county borough council
- A London borough council
- The Common Council of the City of London
- The Council of the Isles of Scilly

- A metropolitan county police authority
- The Northumbria Police Authority
- A metropolitan county fire and civil defence authority
- The London Fire and Civil Defence Authority
- A metropolitan county passenger authority
- The London Waste Regulation Authority
- The West London, North London, East London and Western Riverside Waste Disposal Authorities
- The Merseyside and Greater Manchester Waste Disposal Authorities
- A registered provider such as a housing association which is registered with the Homes and Communities Agency. This only applies if you are a secure tenant; or a former secure tenant of a local authority or another Right to Buy landlord and your home was transferred to a registered provider (see *Preserved Right to Buy* – page 6).

You may not buy your home if you are the tenant of a registered provider which is:

- A charity
- A landlord which has not received public subsidy
- A co-operative association
- The Homes and Communities Agency
