Great Dunmow Neighbourhood Plan Information Statement

A Referendum relating to the Great Dunmow Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 3rd November 2016.

The questions which will be asked in the Referendum is “Do you want Uttlesford District Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Great Dunmow to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

The Referendum area is identified on the map which is included with this information statement. The Referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Great Dunmow Neighbourhood Plan Area.

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if:-

- He or she is entitled to vote in an election of any Councillor of Uttlesford Council whose area is in the Referendum area; and
- His or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A person’s qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be so registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2,799.36. The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 7,413.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
